Goals and Outcomes Desired

- 1. While the individual is of primary importance, the community is also very important. Therefore every person and organization has a simultaneous moral responsibility:

 - to improve the country
- 2. We support the highest ideals of American democracy. Individual rights and liberties including freedoms of the press, speech, and religion, must be maintained.
